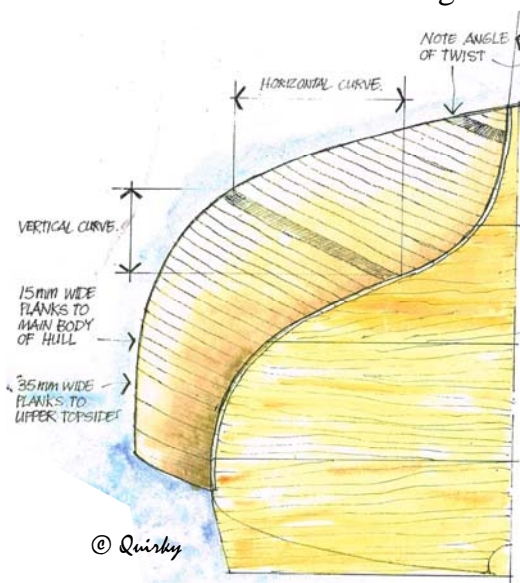

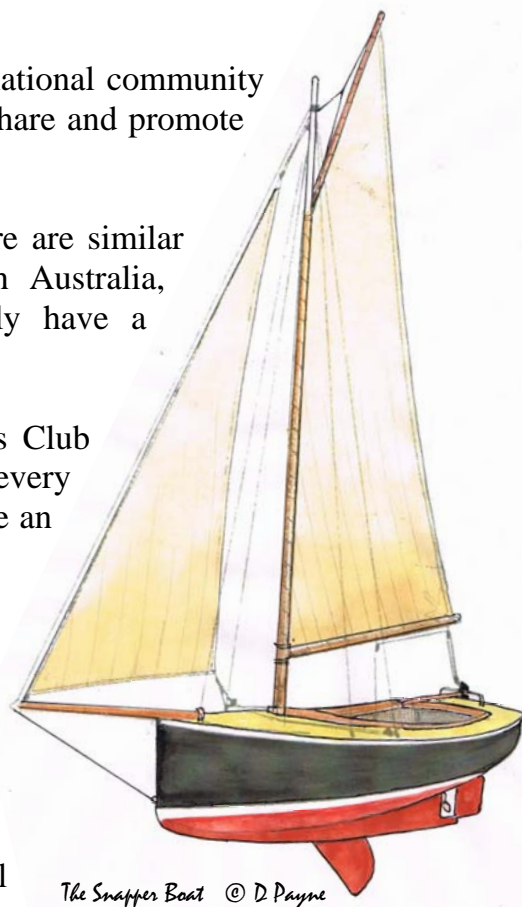

The WBA of NSW has a membership of around 275. There are similar wooden boat organisations in Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania and the ACT that, including NSW, collectively have a membership in excess of 1000.

The Association meets at the Gladesville Bowling & Sports Club (Ryde Rd., Gladesville) at 7.30pm on the second Tuesday of every month to hear talks on a range of topics, swap yarns and share an ale or two.



The WBA of NSW organises a range of activities for members throughout the year including regattas, picnics, boating weekends and other social outings. It also offers members a friendly forum for the exchange of information and advice regarding all aspects of wooden boating. We are interested in the history of boating in Australia and encouraging the preservation of historic and classic boats in our waters.



The WBA of NSW produces a monthly newsletter, SCUTTLEBUTT, for members to share stories on their boating projects and activities, provide a forum to share information and to keep members informed of upcoming activities.
