REQUIREMENTS AND RULES GOVERNING THE AWARD



1. The award is not limited to members of the Wooden Boat Association of NSW.
2. Nominators must be members of the Wooden Boat Association of NSW
3. The Award will be for residents of New South Wales but in exceptional circumstances, non-residents of NSW may be considered.
4. The trophy will be perpetual with the annual recipient(s) suitably acknowledged on the trophy.
5. Custody of the trophy will be at the absolute discretion of the WBA Committee with the intention that members of the Association may be allowed to keep it for a year and that it shall be held by the Association should it be awarded to a non-member.
6. At the time of presentation of the Award, a commemorative plaque will be given to the recipient(s).
7. In a year when the panel of appointed judges considers there are no worthy nominations, the Award will not be presented.
8. Each year the WBA Committee shall appoint a panel of three judges (who are financial members of the Association), selected on the basis of their knowledge of wooden boat building skills and the preservation of wooden boats or maritime artifacts.
9. The decision of the judges will be final.
10. The task or activity of a nominee shall have been completed in the twelve months prior to the closing date of nominations.
11. These rules can be amended at any time by the full committee of the Association.
12. Nominations for the award close on the 30th September each year.
13. Announcement of the winner is made at the WBA meeting in December of each year.
